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CVMC upgrades to 1000 - bed capacity

to provide excellent health care in the region bolstering transformation and constant improvement in the quality of its services, manpower and facilities, the Cagayan Valley Medical Center (CVMC) was upgraded to 1000 bed capacity.

CVMC is one of the teaching and training hospitals in Region II. It accommodates patients throughout Cagayan Valley and nearby provinces of Ilocos and Cordillera Administrative Regions.

On November 13, 2020, President Rodrigo Duterte signed into law Republic Act No. 11498 "An Act Increasing the Bed Capacity of Cagayan Valley Medical Center (CVMC) in Tuguegarao City, Province of Cagayan, from Five Hundred (500) to One Thousand (1000) Beds and Appropriating Funds Therefore."

A consultative public hearing regarding the implementation of the said law was held on December 4, 2020 followed by the approval of Administrative Order No. 2021-0013 which is the Implementing Rules and Regulations (IRR) for RA 11498 by Secretary Francisco T. Duque III. The said IRR was posted on the DOH intranet on February 16, 2021.

Section 2 of RA 11498 stipulates the upgrading of CVMC's

existing professional health care service and facilities in conformity with and commensurate to the increase in bed capacity. The provision is consistent with the Hospital Development Plan (HDP) as approved by the Health Facility Development Bureau, and leads towards a Level 3 Government Hospital with specialty and sub-specialty centers.

CVMC shall provide promotive, preventive, diagnostic, curative, rehabilitative and palliative health care, research and training services in accordance with the provisions of the Universal Health Care Act.

From 2018 to 2019, CVMC recorded an average bed occupancy rate of 158%, which is beyond the 85% national standard, hence, the need to upgrade the hospital's bed capacity and further its development. The increase in the institution's bed-capacity assures the public of an improved CVMC in terms of state-of-the art equipment and facilities, complemented by adequately trained and competent health human resources dedicated to provide quality health care services.

The author and proponents of the Senate Bill No. 1103 and House Bill No. 6144 were Sen. Imee Marcos, Sen. Christopher "Bong" Go and Cong. Joseph Lara, respectively.

he ratification of Universal Health Care (UHC) Act in 2019 gives about 113.8 million Filipinos immediate eligibility and access to health care. shall provide The state essential health benefit packages citizens under the Philippine Health Insurance Corporation (PhilHealth). These include meals and snacks for admitted necessary medications, patients and select laboratory services, and diagnostic procedures for identified medical cases. Based on the official report of the Department of Budget and Management (DBM), PhilHealth has P57.1 billion of budget in 2018. With UHC in place, this means an increase of budget to P71.4 billion - 24.2% higher than that of 2020.

The implementation of UHC is directed towards the achievement of the health system goals of better health outcomes, sustained health financing, and responsive health system by ensuring that all Filipinos, especially the disadvantaged group, have equal access to affordable, quality, and readily available health services that is suitable to their needs.

Under its implementing rules and regulations, a full coverage of the national population shall be granted full access to the entire spectrum of health care. PhilHealth will become the national purveyor of health services by paying health care providers for services given to Filipinos through a greater source of pool of funds. Province- and city-wide health systems shall be in-charge of overseeing health services instead of the current set-up where municipalities manage their own

health centers.

While every Filipino has a constitutional right to healthcare, the country views healthcare more as a privilege than a right because it is difficult for the poor to access medical care. The reality is that most people do not have the capability to prioritize their health when empty plates, rumbling stomachs, and the thought of out-of-pocket expenses vastly outweigh one's regard for health and well-being.

The overarching philosophy is that health is a right and provision of health services is based on need rather than on a person's capacity to pay.

The focus of modern medical practice in our nation is still more skewed to curative than preventive care. It will be impossible to achieve universal health coverage greater and more efficient investment in health services. A few of the realities the government must address is to reform the healthcare system in the direction of UHC by considering widening health inequities, slow progress in reducing health problems, high population growth, unequal distribution of health professionals and skilled workers, failed public health care financing, and weak health

UHC is not an easy system to implement and no single health approach can totally ensure perfection in all aspects of health care services. It is better regarded as a work in progress because health issues will inevitably change overtime. Grounded on the principle of equity, UHC will and should be able to remedy future health problems.

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CVMC receives World Bank donations Charise Gae Mabborang

The World (WB) Bank foundation through its Philippine COVID-19 Emergency Response Project (PCERP) donated medical equipment, supplies and vehicles to several DOH hospitals including Cagayan Valley Medical Center in 2021 and 2022.

The project aims to enhance the capacity of health facilities to prevent, detect, and respond to the peril posed by coronavirus disease and strengthen the national system for public health preparedness.

PCERP has four components. The main component is to strengthen COVID-19 response and its three subcomponents are: (i) provision of medical and laboratory equipment and reagents; (ii) provision of medical supplies including Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), medicines, and ambulance; and, (iii) enhancement of isolation/quarantine facilities.

CVMC is a proud recipient


of the following donations with the corresponding project status:

- a) One-unit Ambulance Type 2 awarded on October 18, 2021, now being managed by the hospital transportation office;
- b) 11 units SV 300 Mechanical Ventilator used in the COVID Isolation Ward, considered as 3rd Generation Ventilators, beneficial for neonatal and geriatric patients requiring ventilatory support. It has modes that can provide both invasive and non-invasive ventilation. From date of donation, a total of 225 patients were hooked to the above ventilators;
- c) Two digital mobile X-ray machines deployed in the Nightingale Ward (COVID ER) and in the COVID Ward. A total of 10,527 x-ray procedures were done both for admitted COVID-19 suspect and confirmed patients;
- d) Upgrading of 5 isolation rooms with negative pressure. This shall

cater severe to critical patients with communicable diseases;

- e) One fully automated RT-PCR machine housed in the CVMC Molecular Laboratory in which 288,243 RT-PCR tests have been conducted as of March 13, 2022; and
- f) One unit Benefusion VP3 Infusion Pump currently used in the Isolation Ward, which helps in delivering fluids and medications.

In its quest to strengthen and broaden the healthcare system during this pandemic, Cagayan Valley Medical Center Telemedicine was launched on June 16, 2021.

Attended representatives by from the press, Medical Center Chief Dr. Glenn Mathew Baggao, Chief Medical Professional Staff Dr. Cherry Lou Antonio and the Telemedicine Committee Chair Dr. Domingo Matammu Jr., the center was formally opened to Outpatient clientele for online consultations in response to Covid-19 pandemic. In 2021, a total of 6,420 calls were recorded with 1,463 scheduled for consultations. From January to April 2022 4,216 calls were received with 759 scheduled telemedicine.


CVMC retains Quality Management System (9001:2015) Cert

To realize its aim to actively participate in the national effort to upgrade health care delivery in the country, Cagayan Valley Medical Center, through the initiative of Dr. Glenn Mathew Baggao and the department heads of Surgery, ENT and Ophthalmology, conducted a series of surgical missions at the City of Ilagan Medical Center (CIMC) on March 11-12, 2022. This is in cooperation with the Philippine College of Surgeons – North Eastern Luzon Chapter. Some 23 beneficiaries were treated and served during the mission that focused mainly on cholecystectomy, thyroidectomy, lobectomy, hernioplasty/herniotomy, and mass excision.

On March 19, the department of surgery, in collaboration with the Philippine Association of Thoracic, Cardiac and Vascular Surgeons, Inc.(PATACSI) held a surgical mission for Arteriovenous Fistula (AVF) Creation and Tunneled Central Venous Cannula (CVC) Insertion. The procedures were done by Vascular Fellows and Consultants in CVMC where 21 patients from Cagayan and Isabela who are suffering from Chronic Kidney Disease (CKD) needing an access site for hemodialysis benefited from the said mission.

A 3-day Quadruple Surgical Mission (Operation Cleft Palate, Operation Cataract, Operation Tuli, and Operation Bukol) was also conducted on April 4-6, 2022 at the Gov. Faustino N. Dy Sr. Memorial Hospital (GFNDMH). The undertaking was made possible through the partnership of CVMC, the provincial government of Isabela, and GFNDMH. 454 patients benefited from the surgical services: 151 for operation tuli; 4 for operation cleft palate; 44 consultations for operation cataract (6 of which underwent surgical procedure); and 255 consultations for operation bukol (50 of which underwent minor operations). 28

The cascading activity on "Handling, Packaging, Documenting, Shipping, and Transport of Valuable Biological Materials (VBM)" participated by 27 registered medical technologists directly and indirectly involved in the preparation and transport of biological materials which crucial in the interest of public health.

The ultimate goal of this seminar is to equip all laboratory personnel involved in packaging, labeling and transporting biological materials with adequate knowledge and skills and become more competent and acquainted with the local and international transport regulations.

This activity is in line with the vision of the Professional Regulation Commission streamline its operations to make its services more accessible and affordable to professionals and Continuing Professional Development (CPD) providers through the computerized CPDAS.

The **PRC** Council Medical Technology approved has

5 CPD units for the said activity. The initiator and resource person of this undertaking, Ms. Lyn Margarette Badajos, recently completed her training on Biorisk Management last March 1 to 4.

CVMC was officially accredited as a CPD provider on July 1, 2020. 👭

Cagayan Valley Medical Center, the largest medical center and training hospital in the region, earned two more accredited training programs. In 2021, the residency training program of the Department of Radiology earned a 4-year accreditation status from the Board of Trustees of the Philippine College of Radiology. The practice-based residency training program of the Department of Family and Community Medicine was recognized as a new program by the Philippine Academy of Family Physicians, Inc.

With the addition of the two to the roster of training programs, CVMC has now the most number of accredited residency training programs in Region II: Internal Medicine; Obstetrics and Gynecology; Surgery; Pediatrics; Anesthesiology; Otorhinolaryngology - Head and Neck Surgery (ORL-HNS); Anatomic and Clinical Pathology; Orthopedics; Family

Medicine (traditional/hospital-based program and practice-based program); and Radiology.

CVMC was recently granted reaccreditation by different specialty societies for the following residency training programs: Anesthesiology (3 years); Pathology (3 years); Otorhinolaryngology - Head and Neck Surgery (ORL-HNS) (4 years); Internal Medicine (3 years); Surgery (2 years); and Pediatrics (4 years). The Pediatric residency training program was granted Level III accreditation status by the Philippine Pediatric Society, making it the only Level III-accredited Pediatric Residency Training Program in the region.

Meanwhile, three other programs - Obstetrics and Gynecology, Orthopedics, and Family Medicine (Traditional/Hospital-based program) - are due for re-accreditation this year.


The rapid spread of SARS-CoV-2 infections has developed fear and anxiety in a global scale. It started as a Public Health Emergency of international concern on January 30, 2020 and was officially declared as a pandemic by the World Health Organization (WHO) on March 11, 2020. The "what, how, why, where, and when" were the many questions that baffled the minds of the curious public which may seem an unending scuffle of things that need answers. The "how" part is the "challenge" to provide faster mitigation of the spread of infection. Indeed, making COVID-19 tests available to the public instantaneously may seem impossible to achieve given the circumstances where time and resources are at stake. This has also challenged leadership to take initiative to confront one of the most appalling events that humanity has to experience in this modern times.

Various testing modalities (antibody tests, rapid antigen tests, and PCR-based tests) have been developed to help catch COVID-19. In the Philippine setting, rapid antibody tests are the first one to be widely utilized, most especially during the first few months of the pandemic. The test, however, only detects the body's immune response to the virus and is not effective at the early phase of infection. In contrast to antibody tests, rapid antigen tests (or more popularly known as RAT) detects the presence of the virus (antigen) itself. RAT is best used when the patient is already experiencing flu-like symptoms. During this time, it is presumed that the body has adequate viral load for the antigen kit to detect; hence, positive RAT results are highly accurate when used in the symptomatic phase. The Center for Disease Control (CDC) and the WHO, however, recommend the use of real time reverse transcriptase polymerase chain reaction (rRT-PCR) in the diagnosis of COVID-19. RT-PCR, like the RAT, also detects the virus (antigen). But compared to RAT where patient must have sufficient viral load for a test to be positive, RT-PCR can amplify even minute amounts of the SARS-CoV-2 viral genetic material (RNA) present in a sample. Hence, RT-PCR can detect the virus at the earliest phase of the infection when viral load is still low. This test, therefore, provides the most accurate and reliable result and is

considered the gold standard test for the diagnosis of COVID-19.

Establishing a Molecular Laboratory is not an easy feat to do. Unlike a regular clinical laboratory, the molecular pathology set up requires complex infrastructures using negative pressure rooms and exhausts as well as expensive machines such as RNA extraction machines, thermocyclers (PCR machine), biosafety cabinets, laminar flow hoods, and ultralow freezers. Nonetheless, the Cagayan Valley Medical Center (CVMC), being the largest DOH-retained, tertiary hospital in Region 2, took on the challenge to set up its own Molecular Laboratory in order to help augment the testing capacity in the Cagayan Valley Region because at that time, only Cagayan Valley CHD (CV CHD) TB Reference Laboratory is capable of testing samples through cartridge-based (GeneXpert) RT-PCR testing. After series of compliances and visits by the DOH Licensing Team, the CVMC COVID 19 Testing Center (Molecular Laboratory) was then inaugurated on August 03, 2020 as the first Molecular Laboratory in Region II capable of performing plate-based RT-PCR testing. This would not have been possible without the relentless efforts of the CVMC's Top Management headed by Dr. Glenn Mathew G. Baggao, Medical Center Chief, and Dr. Cherry Lou M. Antonio, Chief Medical Professional Staff. CVMC Molecular Laboratory has mostly catered to the RT-PCR needs of the entire Region 2 and some parts of Kalinga and Apayao until November of the same year. Three other Molecular Laboratories: Southern Isabela Medical Center (SIMC) Molecular Laboratory, San Antonio City of Ilagan Hospital (SACIH) Molecular Laboratory, and Philippine Red Cross (PRC) - Ilagan City, subsequently followed.

According to Dr. Jane G. Pagaddu, Head of the Department of Pathology and Laboratories, and Dr. Marvin John B. Pua, Section Head of Molecular Laboratory, the utilization of fully automated RNA extraction and PCR machines has allowed the Molecular Laboratory to process as much as 700-800 samples per day to date. They also added that through the creation of an Application Program Initiative (API) system



connection between the Laboratory Information System (LIS) of the Molecular Laboratory and the COVID CODA, real-time releasing of results to the referring facilities was made possible. The successful API integration was a collaborative effort between the information technologists of the Department of Health - Region 2 office and the Integrated Hospital Operation Management Program (IHOMP) Unit of CVMC headed by Mr. June Prodigo. The real-time releasing of results has enabled immediate identification of COVID -19 positive patients which is especially useful in contact-tracing purposes and ultimately in the containment of the spread of the virus.

The journey continues to provide efficient COVID-19 response with the set-up of CVMC COVID 19 Walk-Thru Swab Booth on November 3, 2020. The idea to expand services to all asymptomatic clients needing RT-PCR swab tests has offered greater reach and convenience to clients especially those traveling abroad. The swab booth operates from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm, every day from Monday to Sunday, by appointment. Likewise, establishment of a Rapid Antigen Booth on May 24, 2021 beside the Emergency Department has also greatly helped in terms of initial management of cases while waiting for the RT-PCR result.

We are now two years into the pandemic and this is an unprecedented time in our history as we continue to mitigate and contain the spread of the virus. Laboratory professionals have always been at the frontlines 24/7, selflessly and tirelessly performing the test for the coronavirus and making sure that accurate results are made available. Without the Molecular Laboratories, the diagnosis of COVID-19 infection is simply not conceivable. Without an accurate RT-PCR test result, clinicians are not properly guided in making an appropriate diagnosis and in providing the correct treatment and management for their patients. Indeed, pathologists, medical technologists, and other laboratory staff are the unseen, unsung heroes of this pandemic.

Repurposing Payward: A Paradigm Shift for COVID-19 Response

The confirmation of the first COVID-19 positive patient in CVMC on March 2020 prompted the institution to initiate contingency plans and strategies in order to address the threats of the pandemic.

One strategy is the repurposing of the 150-bed paywards into COVID-19 isolation wards. Each room accommodates one patient which makes it conducive for treatment of patients.

The provision of Hemodialysis, ABG, X-ray, Ultrasound, Operation and Delivery rooms has ensured optimized care for patients. The fifth floor housed the command center where referral is done for prompt and efficient response.

In 2020, a total of 2,578 patients were admitted. This staggering number of patients challenged the resiliency of every staff in the frontline.

The grim outturn of the pandemic almost brought the healthcare system to its knees when there was a surge of cases in 2021, brought about by new variants, propelled the number of admissions to a confounding 7,188 cases. In order to address this unprecedented event, temporary accommodations for patients such as tents are set-up at the Nightingale Ward. This holds a record high admission rate to date.

In January, another surge of cases was recorded following the easing of community quarantine restrictions in the region. However, with a well-placed Strategic Preparedness and Response Plan of the government which includes massive vaccination drive, admissions are in steady decline.

From January to March, there are only 1,518 COVID-related admissions - a decrease by 80%. 28

Greater heights achieved for cancer care services

According to the World Health Organization, cancer burden continues to grow globally, exerting tremendous physical, emotional and financial strain on individuals, families, communities and health systems. Many health systems in low- and middle-income countries are least prepared to manage this burden, and large numbers of cancer patients globally do not have access to timely quality diagnosis and treatment.

To date, the CVMC Cancer Center is designated as a Basic Comprehensive Specialty Center for Cancer Care in the region. From the initial recognition as site for Breast Cancer and Childhood Cancers in 2018, it has evolved as an access site of the Cancer and Supportive-Pallative Medicines Access Program (CSPMAP) under the Department of Health in 2020. The program aims to provide free medicines for identified set of cancer types and to eliminate out-of-pocket costs among the target population. CSPMAP covers eight cancer types: (1)

breast cancer, (2) childhood cancers, (3) gynecologic cancers, (4) liver colorectal and other digestive tract cancers, (5) adult blood cancers [leukemia, lymphoma and myeloma], (6) head-neck-thyroid cancers, (7) lung cancer and, (8) prostate and urinary bladder cancers. The center is also in close coordination with the Medical Social Service Section thru the Medical and Financial Assistance for Indigent and Financially Incapacitated Patients and Malasakit Center.

With its continued quest to deliver quality service to its clients and the strong leadership of the Medical Center Chief Dr. Glenn Mathew G. Baggao, the institution is already equipped with a top-of-the-line Digital Mammography machine for breast cancer screening and diagnosis. The Mammography Unit located at the ground floor of the MRI and Nuclear Medicine Building was inaugurated on February 17, 2022. Services include 2D and 3D screening and diagnostic mammography, Stereotactic

Biopsy, Wire Localization Biopsy, and Ultrasound Guided Vacuum Breast Biopsy.

Additional cervical cancer screening and diagnosis service available in the facility every Tuesdays and Thursdays is the Human Papilloma Virus-Deoxyribonucleic Acid (HPV-DNA) testing and thermal ablation. This is thru the Scale-Up Cervical Cancer Elimination with Secondary Prevention Strategy (SUCCESS) Project spearheaded by DOH and John Hopkins Program for International Education in Gynecology and Obstetrics (JPHIEGO). The service targets testing and treatment of pre-cancerous cervical cancer lesions of women aged 30-49 years old.

Indeed, this achievement serves as a manifestation of CVMC's commitment to be of service to people by its tagline: "bigger, better and more".
